1 JACQUELINE THEIS, OD, FAAO is a practicing optometrist, clinical researcher, international lecturer and author. She received her doctoral and post-doctoral residency training in Neuro-Optometry and Binocular Vision disorders from the University of California at Berkeley School of Optometry. She has extensive clinical experience in post-traumatic brain injury and neurologic visual dysfunctions. She has been awarded the Young Optometrist of the Year award in both California in 2019 and Virginia in 2022.

2 LESLIE O'DELL, OD, FAAO With over two decades of experience in the ophthalmic industry, including collaborations with pharmaceutical and medical device partners, her mission is to drive transformative practice patterns to improve patient outcomes through innovation in medications. As a TFOS Global Ambassador in the US and a founding member of the Intrepid Eye Society (IES), she is dedicated to promoting excellence and fostering the growth of optometry through collaborative efforts among future leaders in the field.

3 DAVID ROSE, OD earned his Doctor of Optometry degree in 2003 from The Ohio State University College of Optometry. He has practiced optometry in a variety of settings, including nursing homes, hospitals for the developmentally disabled, commercial locations and private practice. Currently, he owns Optometric Associates, a private practice in Manassas, VA where he practices optometry to the fullest scope. His services include TBI/ ABI rehabilitation, developmental vision therapy, low vision, myopia control, specialty contact lenses/contact lenses, dry eye, cosmetic optometry and primary care.

4 STEVEN FERRUCCI, OD, FAAO is currently Chief of Optometry at the Sepulveda VA Ambulatory Care Center in North Hills, CA. He is also the Residency Director at his sight, and a Professor at the Southern California College of Optometry/Marshall B. Ketchum University. He is a fellow in both the American Academy of Optometry and the Optometric Retinal Society, as well as Past-president of the ORS and the Founding Chair of the American Academy of Optometry Retinal Special Interest Group.

5 JUSTIN KWAN, OD, FAAO is a 2009 graduate of Berkeley Optometry and went on to do a contact lens and dry eye residency at residency at SCCO. He taught and saw patients there for eight years before moving to Chicago in 2018, joining a private practice. In April 2020, he transitioned to Cooper Vision full time, dedicated to myopia management. He has given over 100 hours of continuing education. He is the current president of the Chicago North Side Optometric Society.

6 MARK SCHAEFFER, OD, FAAO serves as Clinical Excellence Captain at MyEyeDr in Birmingham, Alabama, where he practices full-scope optometry. Dr. Schaeffer is a Founding Member of the Intrepid Eye Society, and is a member of the Alabama and American Optometric Association, American Academy of Optometry and the Contact Lens and Cornea Section. Dr. Schaeffer earned his Doctor of Optometry from Southern College of Optometry, and completed a residency in Ocular Disease at Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in Miami, Florida.

7 TAMARA PETROSYAN, OD is an associate clinical professor at SUNY College of Optometry in the Primary Care, Ocular Disease, Pediatrics, and Vision Therapy departments. Dr. Petrosyan helped implement free pediatric exams for over 30,000 children through the Armenian Eyecare Project, developed over a dozen vision therapy workbooks, and helped start and previously worked with Anteo Health where she developed all of the vision therapy content. Among others, she has been awarded the Young Optometrist of the Year and Optometrist of the Year from NJSOP and the Young Optometrist of the Year award from the AOA.

8 LAUREEN WALDRON, OD earned her doctorate in 1993 and began practicing as an optometrist in NYC. After three years of practice, she joined the U.S.A.F. at the Rank of Captain. With a breadth of experience ranging from retail, hospital-based optometry, nursing home care, acute care, and a flair for the unusual contact lens fittings for everything from the average eye to the diseased or post-surgical eyes. 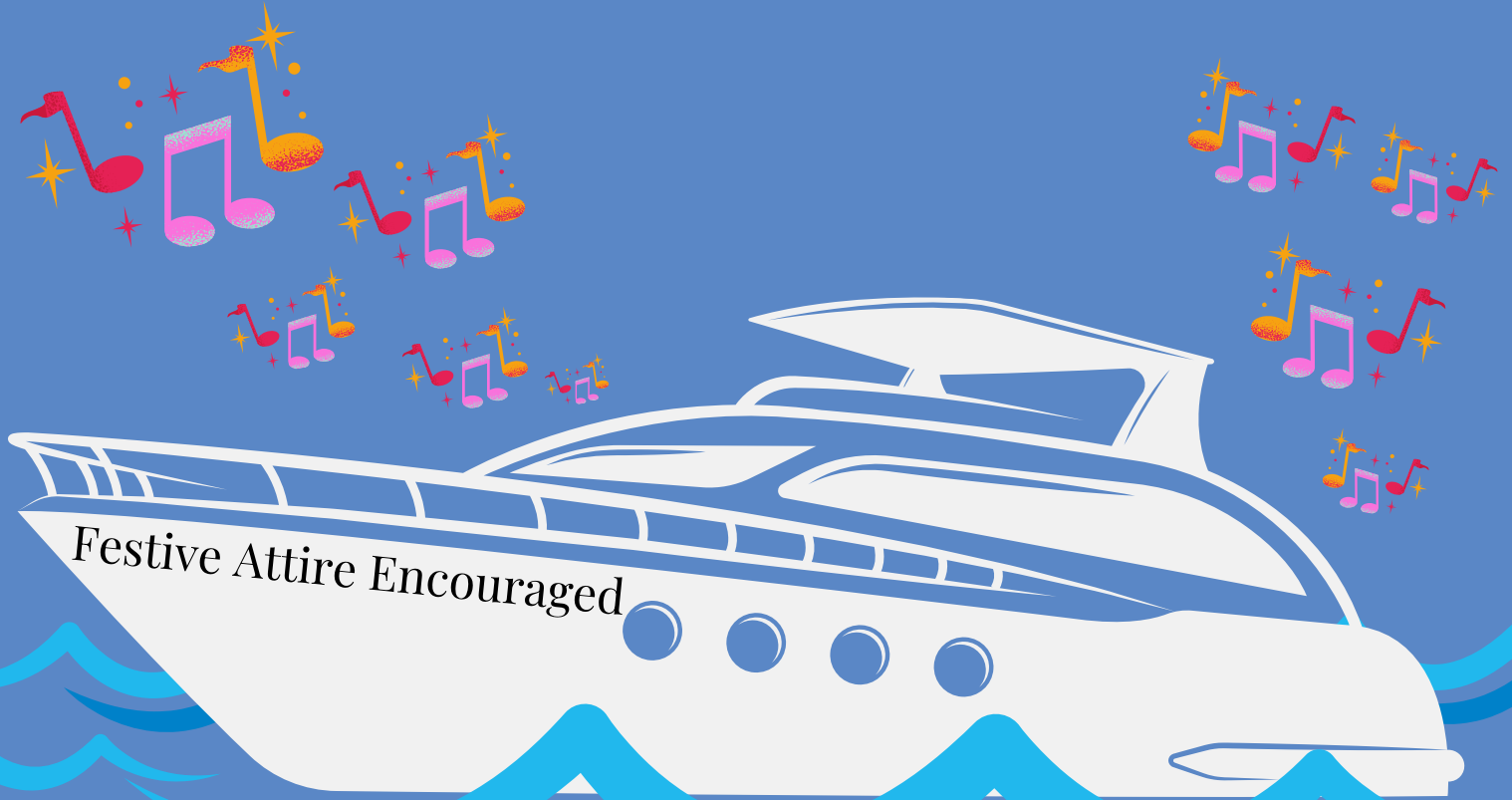
