

5:00 pm – 7:00 pm Course 1: Glaucoma: Conversations Beyond IOP *Benjamin Casella, OD, FAAO*

The glaucomas are a multifactorial family of optic neuropathies. The traditional approach has been and still is the lowering of IOP. To that end, no therapeutic approach has proven worthy of coming before current treatment of IOP. There are, however, therapeutic approaches coming to light in glaucoma labs and in the world's literature which highlight the need for and existence of glaucoma treatment modalities which go beyond just lowering IOP.

The eyelids play a crucial role in maintaining ocular surface health, uniquely designed to protect and support the eye. 1:00 pm – 3:00 pm **Course 7: Shedding Light on Sight: Demystifying GA and AMD for Early Detection and Intervention** *Julie Rodman, OD, MSc, FAAO, FORS*

This course will provide an overview of Age-Related Macular Degeneration including epidemiology, pathophysiology, and risk factors. A detailed analysis of the various stages of AMD will be introduced and illustrated via case examples. The advanced stages of the disease will be emphasized highlighting the use of multimodal imaging including OCT, Fundus Autofluorescence, Color Fundus Photography and Near-Infrared Imaging. New treatment and management options for Geographic Atrophy will be discussed.

3:00 pm – 4:00 pm **Course 8: Ocular Rheumatology; An Anterior Segment Perspective** *Selina McGee, OD, FAAO, Dipl ABO*

This lecture will delve into and help describe anterior segment inflammation, specifically autoimmune and rheumatologic inflammation and its role in ocular pathologies. A focus will be biologics and biological therapies, as they are beginning to be investigated for ocular conditions such as dry eye, uveitis and other pathologies. We will also review the systemic and ocular manifestations of conditions like Sjogren's syndrome, rheumatoid arthritis, lupus, sarcoidosis, and thyroid dysfunction. We will review pertinent blood work and how to assess the results of blood work for rheumatologic conditions. We will also discuss the importance of the collaborative approach, and communicating with providers in other specialties that are also involved in the care of these patients.



Benjamin Casella, OD, FAAO

Dr. Benjamin Casella is an Augusta, Georgia native and a proud graduate of the University of Georgia, where he earned his B.A. cum laude in 2003. He went on to receive his Doctor of Optometry degree, also cum laude, from the University of Alabama at Birmingham School of Optometry in 2007. Dr. Casella completed a Residency in Ocular Disease at the SUNY State College of Optometry in 2008 and has been practicing optometry since 2007. Outside of patient care, Dr. Casella enjoys music, spending time with his family, and writing a local beer column. Bruce Dornn, OD

Dr. Dornn graduated from the University of Manitoba with an honors degree in microbiology. He attended the New England College of Optometry in Boston, MA, graduating in 1997. Practiced in Denver, Colorado until 1998 and returned to Winnipeg where he founded Dornn Eye Care. Over many years he developed a Dry Eye Center of excellence and in 2012 established Eye-Revive Inc. Eye-Revive is a company that sells an extensive line of dry eye products, available exclusively through Optometric offices.



Jason Ellen, OD

Jason Ellen, OD is the Founding Partner and President of Oklahoma Medical Eye Group, a multidisciplinary/multispecialty referral group located in Jenks, Oklahoma. Dr. Ellen graduated Cum Laude from Northeastern State University College of Optometry in May 1999, and furthered his education by completing an ocular disease and refractive surgery residency through BVA Advanced Eyecare and TLC Laser Eye Center in Oklahoma City. During that time Dr. Ellen became the first optometric resident in the US to perform Laser Refractive Surgery (PRK). He is active in the OAOP serving as Past President to the Executive Board and serves as a mentor and associate professor to students at NSUOCO. Dr. Ellen was named the Young Optometrist of the Year by the OAOP in 2005 and Outstanding Alumni in 2009 by Southern Arkansas University and Optometrist of the Year by the OAOP in 2021. He is married to Dr. Rona Ellen (who completed her Doctor of Veterinary Medicine in 2008) and they have three boys; Drake (25 years old), Lucas (20 years old) and Rafe (16 years old).



Selina McGee OD, FAAO, Dipl ABO

Dr. Selina McGee is the Visionary Founder and Owner of BeSpoke Vision. She is a nationally recognized expert at the intersection of ocular aesthetics, dry eye disease, and leadership in modern eyecare. She leads with intention and empowers doctors to implement confidently, lead authentically, and elevate both patient outcomes and the profession itself. Julie Rodman, OD, MSC, FAAO

Dr. Julie Rodman is Chief of the Broward Eye Care Institute in Fort Lauderdale, FL and a Professor of Optometry at Nova Southeastern University. She serves as the Instructor of Record for Posterior Segment Disease at the College. Her research interests include OCT/OCTA and Vitreoretinal Disease. Dr. Rodman has authored over fifty publications with an emphasis on retinal disease. She is the author of "Optical Coherence Tomography Atlas: A Case Study Approach", the first reference book on this topic written by an optometrist. 


