

COURSE 1 ELECTRORETINOGRAM (ERG) AND THE DISEASE

1 CE Hour

Electroretinograms can be an important diagnostic tool. It is a procedure that can be performed and billed by the optometric profession. This lecture will go over the test's physiology and interpretation. Secondly, it will review the different diagnosis that can be associated with the interpretation.

Non-organic vision loss (NOVL) is a rare ocular finding but a diagnosis that can be associated with a lot of confusing test results. This lecture will go over signs, symptoms, testing, and diagnosis of non-organic vision loss. We will review an actual case and go over the visual system from anterior to posterior in order to properly explain elimination of differential diagnosis.
